				<ul> <li>Temperatures and sunshine in England in April were above average, and rainfall was below average, except in the North West.</li> <li>Good Friday 2015 was on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April (April 18<sup>th</sup> in 2014), and Easter Monday was on the 6<sup>th</sup> of April (April 21<sup>st</sup> in 2014). Please note that trips that started in the week prior in March and continued to Easter were included in the March results.</li> </ul>

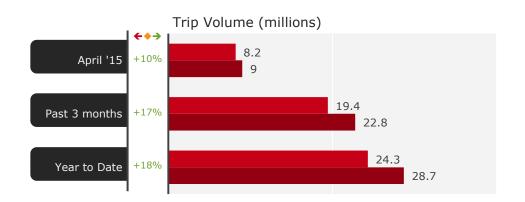

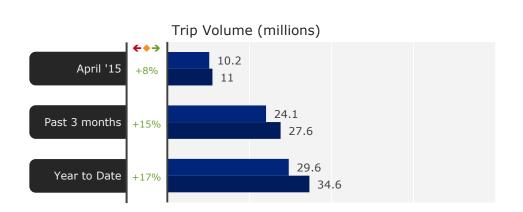


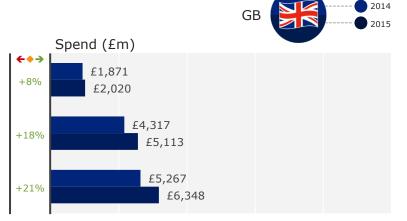

Volume of trips (millions) (2014 vs 2015)

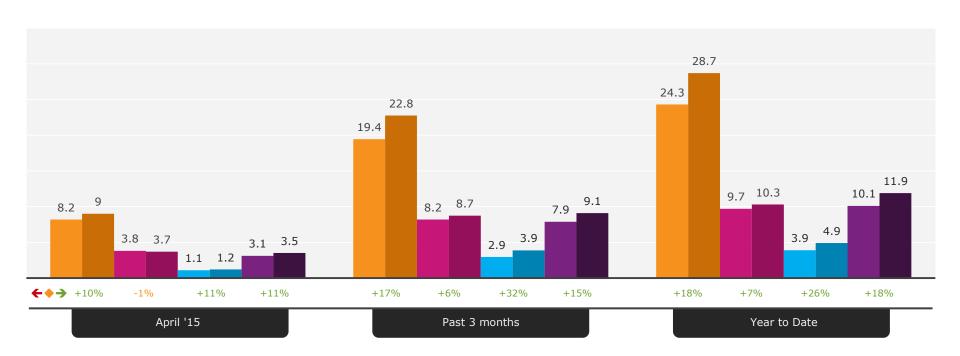
















#### Nights England

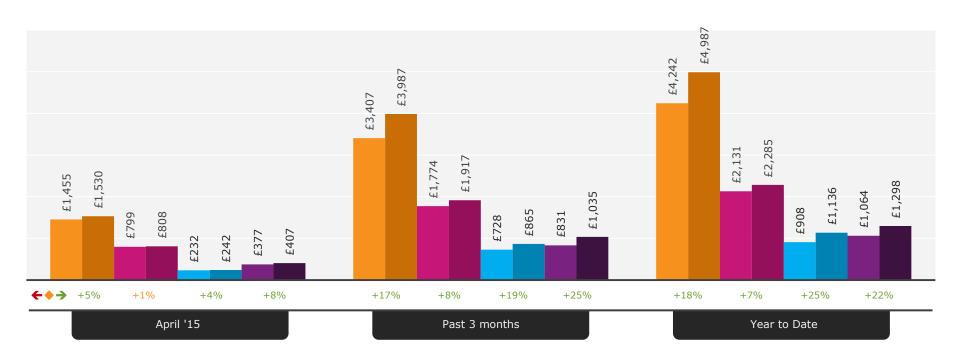












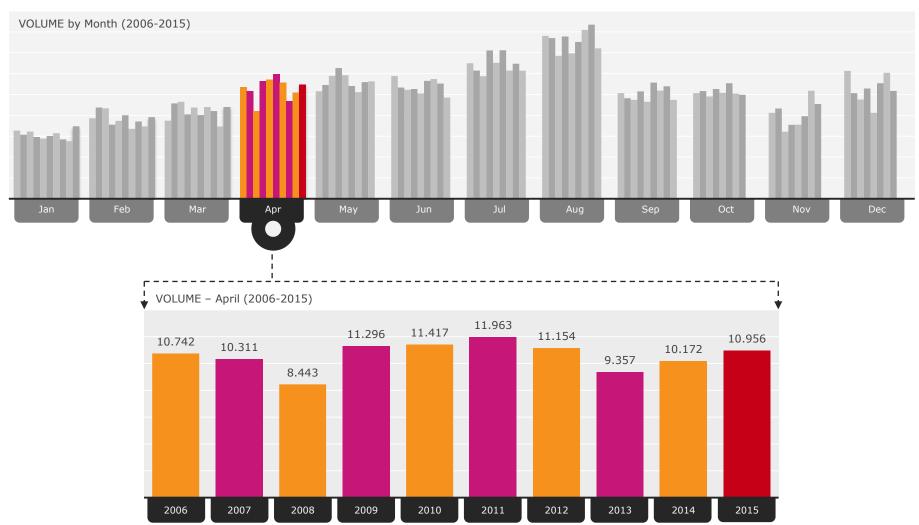




# Long Term Trends by Month GB

### Long Term Trends, Year-to-Year England



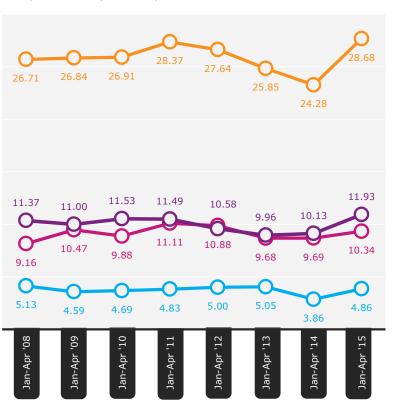

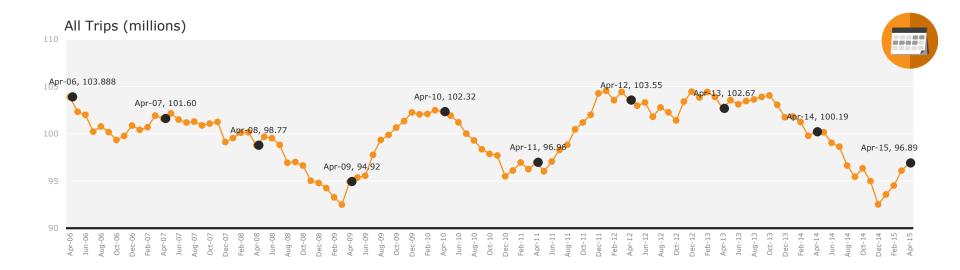

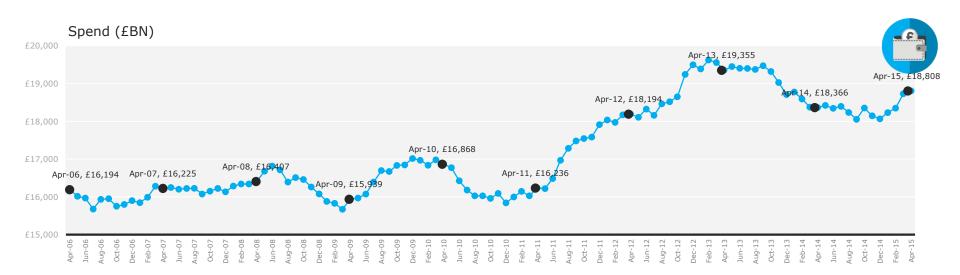




#### Rolling 12 Month Trendlines England

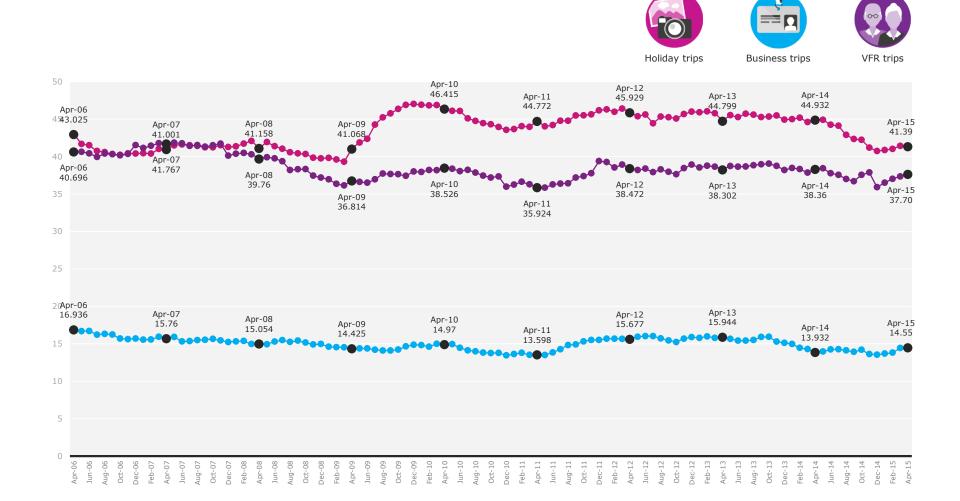






### Rolling 12 Month Trendlines England

Spend by purpose (£m)



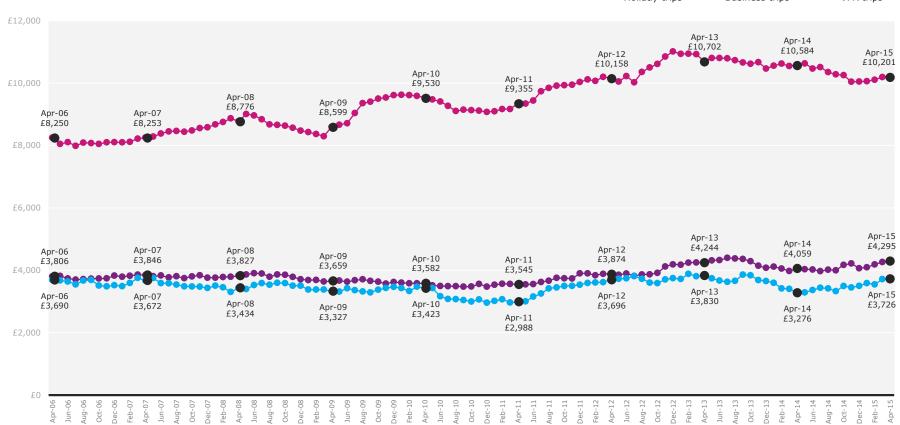

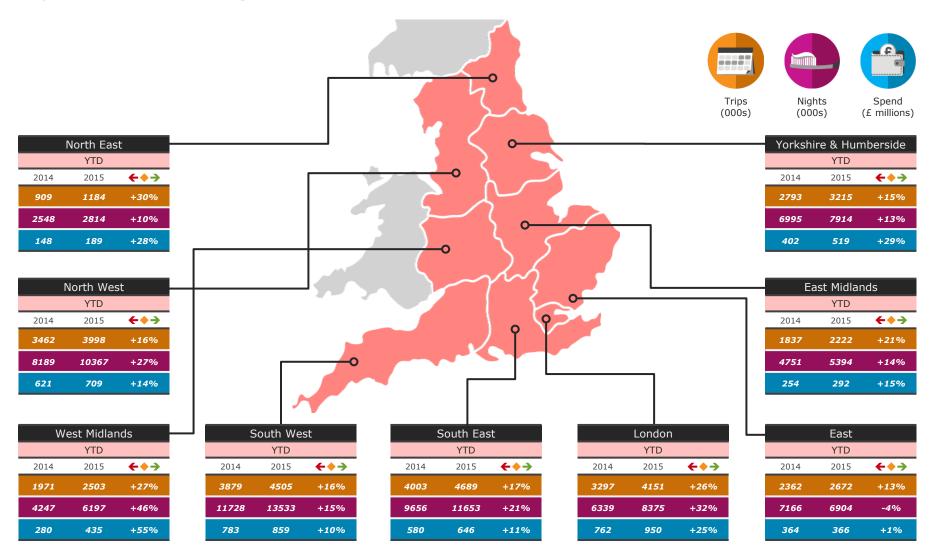

Trip characteristics – region (2014 vs 2015)



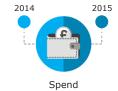

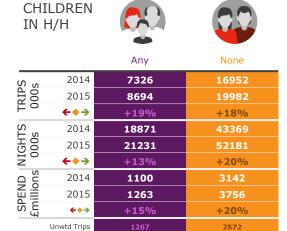

#### Note about these results:

The GB Tourism Survey is a survey of British residents, in which 2000 respondents are interviewed each week, making a total of 100,000 each year.

Any respondent having taken one or more overnight trips in the previous 4 week period is asked to describe the details of trips taken. Each year, data from around 17,000 trips is collected, and this is subsequently grossed up to provide population estimates. On an annual basis, the survey is extremely robust, with a confidence level for England data at +/-3% at the 95% level for the number of trips and nights measured, and +/-4% for the expenditure figure.

For shorter time periods and for other subsets of the data such as region or trip purpose, the margin of error is wider – guidance on confidence intervals at national and regional level for annual and quarterly data is provided on the next page.
