By bus

Getting to Bristol



- Bristol is served by Bristol International Airport with easy connections to the city centre on the Airport Flyer bus service.
- The train from London Paddington takes around 1 hour 40 minutes direct to Bristol Temple Meads with Great Western Railway.
- Coaches are also available from London to Bristol via megabus, National Express and Flixbus with a journey time of approximately 2 hours 20 minutes.
