- Head out from Cardiff on the iconic Cambrian Way, a 185-mile (300km) driving route through the heart of Wales featuring National Parks, castles, mountains and more.

Did you know?

Cardiff is actually home to two castles. Alongside Cardiff Castle, Morgraig Castle was only discovered in the 20th century but is thought to be over 600 years old. It lies north of the city, near Caerphilly.

Trains run into Cardiff Central Station from destinations across Britain. Find information and train times to plan your journey with [Great Western Railway](#).

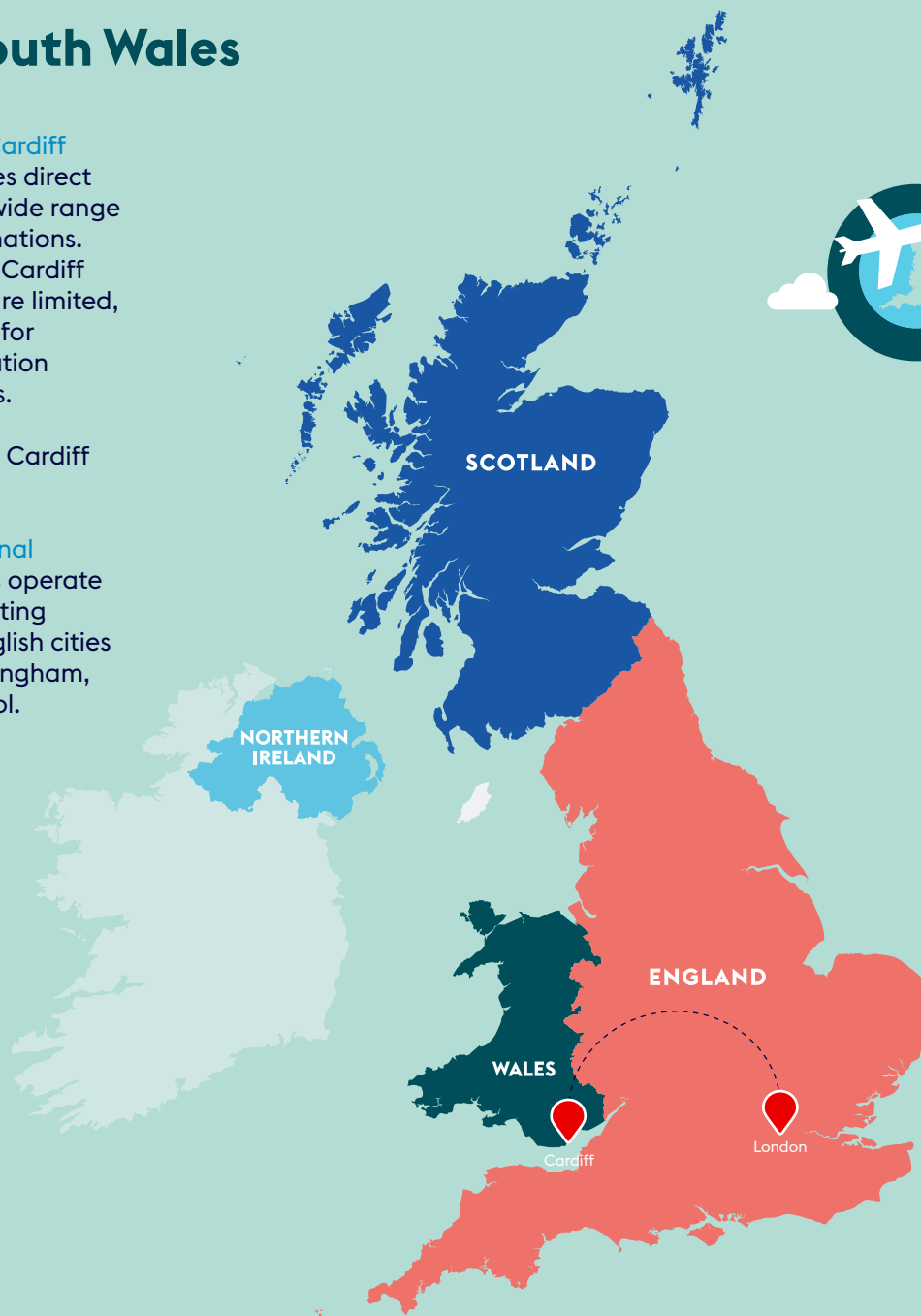
Getting to Cardiff

Located in South Wales

 The city is served by **Cardiff Airport**, which operates direct flights to and from a wide range of international destinations. Non-stop flights from Cardiff to airports in the UK are limited, but travellers can opt for alternative transportation such as trains or buses.

 Trains from London to Cardiff take 2 hours.

 Companies like **National Express** and **Megabus** operate regular routes connecting Cardiff with major English cities such as London, Birmingham, Manchester and Bristol.
