## **Getting around**

With a 24-hour bus service running from the airport to the city centre plus buses, trains and the tram, getting around Edinburgh is a breeze. Lothian Network Day tickets provide unlimited one-day travel on Lothian trams and buses. There are also Hop-on Hop-off Bus Tours.



## By bus

Buses run 24 hours a day. Lothian buses is one of the main operators.



## By tram

Edinburgh Tram covers 15 stops between Edinburgh Airport and York Place.



## By taxi

Licensed black cabs, Central Taxis and City Cabs, take up to five people per car, a good option for a family or group of friends. Taxis can be hailed on the street.

# **Getting to Edinburgh**

# Located in central-eastern Scotland

- Flights from London Heathrow and Gatwick to Edinburgh take 1 hour 10 minutes.
- Edinburgh Airport serves international routes to Europe, the Americas and the UAE
- Trains from London to Edinburgh take around 4 hours 20 minutes. Other popular train routes run from Manchester, Liverpool, Newcastle and Aberdeen.
- The Caledonian Sleeper runs between London and Edinburgh and offers overnight train travel.
