### By punt

## On foot

Oxford's main attractions are best explored on foot. The city centre is only a 15-minute walk from the train station. There are plenty of walking routes for those who want to explore the surrounding countryside.

The Oxford Bus Company provides frequent and affordable travel across the city, as well as Stagecoach which also operates routes to Blenheim Palace.



## By bike

Oxford is a city made for cycling. There are several dockless bike hire operators that allow users to access cycles via a free downloadable app.

# Located in South East England, in the county of Oxfordshire

- ★ Heathrow is the closest international airport and is 45 miles (72 kilometres) away.
- Trains from London to Oxford take around 1 hour. The train from Heathrow to Oxford takes up to two and a half hours via central London.
- The coach from London to
  Oxford takes 1 hour 30 minutes.
