The UK Government has announced the next phase in the roll out of <u>Electronic Travel</u> <u>Authorisations (ETAs)</u>. An ETA gives visitors permission to travel to the UK. By April 2025, all visitors who do not need a visa will need an electronic travel authorisation (ETA) to travel to the UK.

- Gulf Cooperation Council visitors already need an ETA to travel to and transit through the
- Eligible non-Europeans can apply in advance from 27 November 2024 and will need an ETA to travel from 8 January 2025.
- Eligible Europeans can apply from 5 March 2025 and will need an ETA to travel from 2 April 2025.

An ETA costs £10 and permits multiple journeys to the UK for stays of up to six months at a time over two years or until the holder's passport expires – whichever is sooner. The introduction of ETAs is in line with the approach many other countries have taken to border security.
