New accommodation, restaurants, and innovative food venue openings

Dao by Dorsett North, London, England

Winter 2024

Dao by Dorsett North London will bring 68 serviced apartments to Crouch End, blending historical charm with modern comforts in the restored Grade II* listed Town Hall. Beyond stylish accommodation, the venue will offer co-working spaces, a cinema, recording studios and a rooftop bar, making it a vibrant cultural hub.

Seaton House, St Andrews, Scotland

February 2025

Seaton House will offer luxurious 5-star accommodation near the iconic Old Course in St Andrews. This elegant hotel promises a unique stay for golf enthusiasts and those seeking opulence, with world-class facilities and breathtaking views across West Sands Beach.

Gordon Ramsay restaurants at 22 Bishopsgate, London, England

February 2025

Gordon Ramsay will open five restaurants on the 59th, 60th and 61st storeys of 22 Bishopsgate this year – making them the Capital's new highest dining destinations – including Lucky Cat and Bread Street Kitchen, plus the Gordon Ramsay Academy cookery school. This lively new venue will be located in the city centre, seating up to 350 diners amid colourful murals and artworks by local creatives. Like its sister food hall, Society Manchester, we can expect live music, events and DJ sets too, with a buzzing atmosphere from lunchtime until late.

Hotel Gotham Newcastle, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, England

Spring 2025

Hotel Gotham in Newcastle-upon-Tyne will redefine the hospitality experience when it opens in Spring 2025. Set in the historic Old Fire Station, the hotel will offer 60 bespoke bedrooms, a stylish restaurant, a bar with a DJ booth and an event space in the former Court Rooms that can accommodate up to 120 guests. Thirty additional rooms will be available in the adjacent Police Station side of the hotel in autumn 2025.

SXSW London, London, England

2 – 7 June 2025

Since 1987, SXSW (pronounced "South By Southwest") has gathered the world's top musicians, creatives, thinkers and entrepreneurs in Texas, USA – and this year, it will host its first European festival in London. Explore an immersive journey through the fascinating world of seeds, illuminated by hundreds of stunning light installations created by renowned artists and local community groups. Join a festive celebration that transforms Wakehurst into a spectacular wonderland!

New tours, attractions, experiences and entertainment venues

New tours of Buckingham Palace's East Wing, London, England

Mid-January – late May 2025

Visitors to Buckingham Palace will soon be able to explore its East Wing, seeing the detail and craftsmanship of its artworks and architecture up-close – all at a time when the Palace isn't usually open to the public. These new 90-minute tours, which do not include a visit to the State Rooms, will be led by expert guides in groups of up to 20 people. Visitors will enter through the Palace's front gates and across the famous Forecourt – just as guests do for official royal events



– before touring the Centre Room, from which they will have a view of the central balcony and the Victoria Memorial.

Wellness retreats at Three Choirs Vineyards, Gloucestershire, England

10 – 11 January & 31 January – 1 February 2025

The award-winning Three Choirs Vineyards will kick off the year with its first ever wellness weekend breaks. They'll commence on the Friday afternoons with a wine tasting session, while the Saturdays will feature exercise classes, pilates, yoga, breathwork and sound healing. With a pop and jazz-inspired score, the production is set in the opulent world of Jay Gatsby's parties.

Portsmouth to be host city for UK Pride, Portsmouth, England

7 June 2025

Portsmouth has been selected as the UK Pride host city for 2025, so expect its parades, protests and parties to be bigger and brighter than ever before. Last year, the city hosted around 20,000 people at its Pride events – ranging from talks and workshops to its parade along the waterfront – plus live concerts, after parties and a meet-and-greets.

Liverpool Biennial: UK's Largest Festival of Contemporary Art, Liverpool, England

7 June – 14 September 2025

Liverpool Biennial returns as Britain's largest free festival of contemporary visual art. Showcasing cutting-edge works from international and local artists across the city, the festival transforms Liverpool into a dynamic canvas, inviting art lovers to experience groundbreaking exhibitions and performances. This celebration of creativity is a must-visit for anyone seeking to explore the future of visual art.

Reopening of Tate Liverpool, Liverpool, England

Autumn 2025

After closing for two years of extensive renovation work, Tate Liverpool will reopen in the city in autumn 2025 – with a landmark programme that will showcase its world-class collection and £30m refurbishment. Until then, the Tate has partnered with RIBA North, the Royal Institute of British Architects' national architecture centre, to host a series of exhibitions on Mann Island on Liverpool's waterfront. The site will also boast beautiful outdoor gardens, offering peaceful spots for relaxation. With a mission to educate and inspire both tourists and the local community, the Eden Project Morecambe is positioned to become a key player in promoting ecological awareness in the region.

Camden Highline, London, England

2027

Camden is getting its very own "sky park", which will run along a disused railway line between Camden and King's Cross. The north London Park will be split into three sections, starting at Camden Gardens with a staircase through a tree canopy, followed by an area of viewing platforms, communal tables, woodland areas, purpose-built habitats and an orchard of fruit trees. Planning approval has been granted: the project is currently raising funds, with the intention of opening in 2027.

British stadiums to host UEFA EURO 2028, Nationwide

2028

UK and Ireland will host the UEFA European Football Championship in 2028 – the third time that the Euros will be played in England, after 1996 and 2021. The matches will be held at London's Wembley Stadium, London's Tottenham Hotspur Stadium, Manchester's City of Manchester Stadium, Liverpool's Everton Stadium, Newcastle's St James' Park and Birmingham's Villa Park.
